From Snow (9900 11), cut:

- \* {A} (4) 1" x 6½" strips
- \* {B} (2) 1¾" x 2½" rectangles
- \* {C} (1) 1¾" x 2" rectangles

From Peacock (9900 216), cut:

- \* {D} (2) 1¾" x 4¼" rectangles

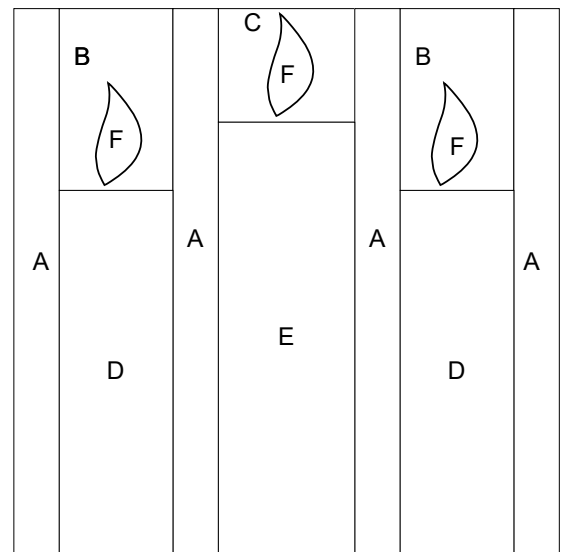
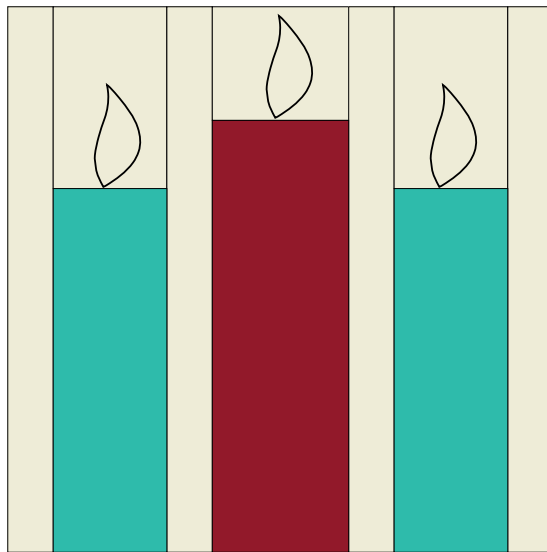
From Country Red (9900 17), cut:

- \* {E} (1) 2" x 5¼" rectangles

From Template F, cut:

- \* {F} (3) flames from yellow/gold fabric OR use template to mark and embroider with yellow embroidery floss

- 9900 11 snow
- 9900 169 ruby ice
- 9900 65 green
- 9900 121 betty's green
- 9900 216 peacock
- 9900 77 dill
- 9900 14 christmas green
- 9900 88 bubble gum
- 9900 120 betty's pink
- 9900 258 geranium
- 9900 47 scarlet
- 9900 17 country red



## WARM EVENING GLOW

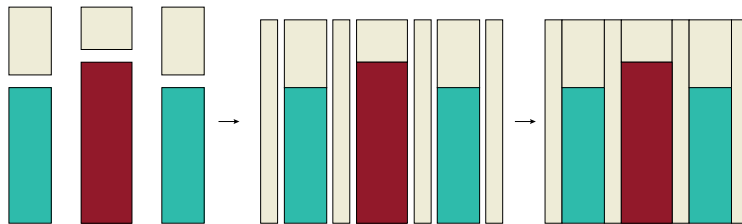

YIELD 6½" square unfinished

**STEP 1. MAKE CANDLES**

Stitch background rectangles to the tops of the candle bases. Press. Sew 1" x 6½" background strips in between to create the candles. Press.

**STEP 2. MAKE FLAMES**

Use your favorite method of applique to add the flames.

Alternatively, the flames can be stitched using a yellow embroidery floss. Use the template and non-permanent marking pen to transfer the design to your block. Outline using a simple stitch.

Completed block measures 6½" square unfinished.
