## Quilters Basics

Read instructions before beginning a project.  
Label and sort pieces when cutting.  
Press as you go. Press seams in one direction.

Finished Quilt: 76"x76"

Finished Block: 9"x9"

### Helpful Hints with Wovens:

- Do Not pre wash fabric
- Press with a dry iron to avoid distortion
- Use a scant 1/4" seam allowance
- Chain piece strips for consistent piecing

Backing – 4 3/4 yds

## Cutting

*Hint: For easy piecing, label and sort the strips by set (A or B) and length.*

SET A – Fabrics 1 – 6

From **each** color in Set A cut:

15 – 1 1/2" x WOF strips

Subcut 11 strips of **each** of the following lengths – 9 1/2", 8 1/2", 7 1/2", 6 1/2", 5 1/2", 4 1/2".

Total strips for Set A – 396.

SET B – Fabrics 7 – 11

From Fabric 7 cut:

23 – 1 1/2" x WOF strips

Subcut 22 strips of **each** of the following lengths – 8 1/2", 7 1/2", 6 1/2", 5 1/2", 4 1/2", 3 1/2".

From **each** of the remaining colors in Set B (8-11) cut:

13 – 1 1/2" x WOF strips

Subcut 11 strips of **each** of the following lengths – 8 1/2", 7 1/2", 6 1/2", 5 1/2", 4 1/2", 3 1/2".

Total strips for Set B – 396.

## SETTING AND CORNER TRIANGLES

From Fabric 12 cut:

2 – 14" x WOF strips

Subcut 5 – 14" squares cut twice diagonally for setting triangles



1 – 7 1/4" x WOF strips

Subcut 2 – 7 1/4" squares cut once diagonally for corner triangles

## CENTERS AND BINDING

From Fabric 13 cut:

6 – 3 1/2" x WOF strips

Subcut 61 – 3 1/2" squares for centers  
9 – 2 1/2" x WOF strips for binding

*Hint: When cutting strips of multiple lengths, always cut the longest first.*

## Block Construction – 61 Blocks

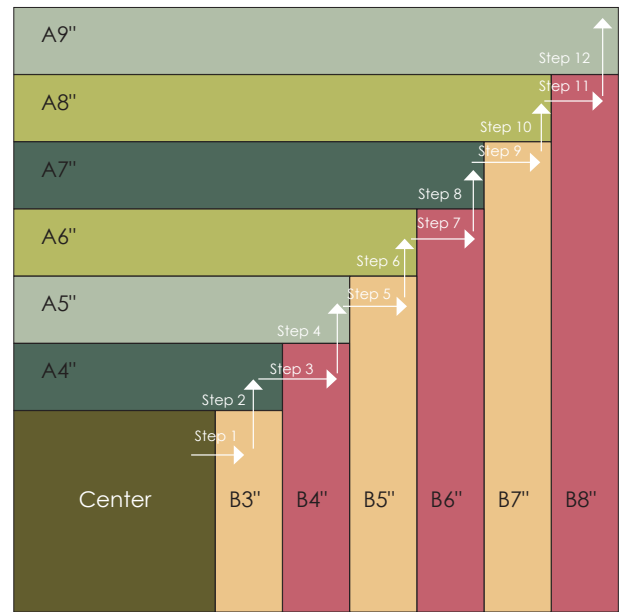
*Note: The various fabrics are used once in every block with the exception of Fabric 7 and it is used twice.  
Press all seams away from center square.*

With right sides together, stitch the following:

- Step 1: Add a B3 strip to right side of Center square. Press.  
 Step 2: Add A4. Press.  
 Step 3: Add B4. Press.  
 Step 4: Add A5. Press.  
 Step 5: Add B5. Press.  
 Step 6: Add A6. Press.  
 Step 7: Add B6. Press.  
 Step 8: Add A7. Press.  
 Step 9: Add B7. Press.  
 Step 10: Add A8. Press.  
 Step 11: Add B8. Press.  
 Step 12: Add A9. Press.  
 Step 13: Square up block to measure  $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 9\frac{1}{2}"$  with seams.

Repeat Steps 1-13 with remaining strips. As you sew, vary the color placement within each set. Make 61 quarter log cabin blocks.

Each block should measure  $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 9\frac{1}{2}"$  with seams.



## Assemble Quilt

Piece blocks into rows beginning and ending with a setting triangle (*note direction of setting triangles*)

Make:

- 2 Row 1s – 1 block, 2 setting triangles & 1 corner triangle.
- 2 Row 2s – 3 blocks and 2 setting triangles
- 2 Row 3s – 5 blocks and 2 setting triangles
- 2 Row 4s – 7 blocks and 2 setting triangles
- 2 Row 5s – 9 blocks and 2 setting triangles
- 1 Row 6s – 11 blocks and 2 corner triangles

*Press seams in odd number rows (1,3,5) to the left and seams in the even rows (2,4,6) to the right.*

*This will allow seams to "nest" for easier piecing. Follow arrows on diagram.*

Join 1 each of rows 1-6. Press. Then add remaining rows in reverse order 5-1. Press. Quilt top should measure  $76\frac{1}{2}" \times 76\frac{1}{2}"$  with seams.

## Finishing

Using a bias seam, join 9  $2\frac{1}{2}"$  wide Binding strips together end to end. Press seams open. Fold prepared strip in half wrong sides together. Press.

Layer, quilt and bind.
